### What is Aqua fit?

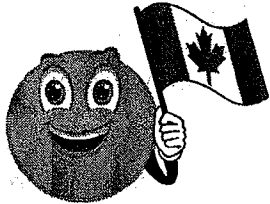

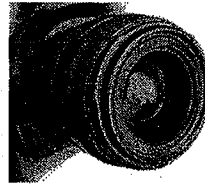

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's is requesting price quotes for installation of concrete pads for a portable 30 foot truck scale at it's Transfer Station in Geoggan.

All construction is to be in compliance with design provided and must be completed by July 10, 2009 without exception (Weigh-tronix #141326).

- ▶ As per drawing, steel bulkhead will be used
- ▶ The concrete pads must be made to the dimensions as per our drawings and placed/located as per our drawings.
