





Did You Know?

The brook trout [Salvelinous Fontinalis] is Nova Scotia's official fish. It has a long history in, and is culturally significant to our province. Sport fishers prize this species. Brook

trout may stay fairly close to established feeding stations through the season, if there is cover. They have a hierarchy at these stations, but will share cover.

Spawning takes place in the fall. Females make an indentation [redd] in the river bed where there is ground water upwelling. The fertilized eggs mature over the winter and hatch in the spring. They are mature in 3 years and rarely live over 5 years.

Question: There is a clue in the above text to why fontinalis is part of the scientific name.

Answer to last month's question: Anti-twilight arch, found in the eastern sky, is the earth's shadow cast on the atmosphere by the setting sun.

Physical Activity Frenzies - Part 3

Do you want to improve your health and get fit? Try running! Running reduces your risk of developing heart disease, high blood pressure, diabetes, several types of cancer, and even the common cold.

Running makes it easier to do simple everyday tasks such as climbing stairs and keeping up with an active child. And if it is weight you are worried about, running can burn that excess body fat and create a leaner you.

So how do you get active, and find your inner runner?

- 1. First, check with your doctor when starting to run. This is especially important if you or your family have heart problems, high cholesterol, breathing problems, diabetes or if you're overweight or smoke.
- 2. Secondly, get well-fitted, well cushioned running or cross trainer sneakers.
- 3. Third, wear comfortable, loose-fitting clothes. If the temperature is low, dress in layers you can strip off as you warm up.
- 4. Fourth, ask a friend to join you. When getting starting, it helps to find a friend to run with. You'll end up motivating each other.
- 5. Fifth, schedule time for your workout- mark it on your calendar. If you set aside a certain time, you are more likely to stick to the program.
- 6. Sixth, keep a log. You'll be surprised and proud of how much you are doing. Tracking your progress gives you a grasp on your accomplishments, and motivates you even more in the process to keep going.
- 7. Lastly, have fun. Running is about getting fit to lead a better, healthier life. Put your favorite "pump-up songs on your mp3 player.

Running is an easy and affordable way to get active. Start off slow. The more fun you make it, the more enjoyable it will be.
