

Dry Hydrants

The Capital Budget for 2015/16 included \$60,000 for the installation of dry hydrants that enhance fire services throughout the municipality. Three dry hydrants have been installed in Ecum Secum, Liscomb, and Jordanville. A contract has been awarded for the fourth to be installed in Port Bickerton.

Rural Internet Study

The Nova Scotia Department of Business has engaged a third party consulting firm to report the current state of internet access and reliability in rural communities. The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's has expressed the concerns that were brought forward by our residents. Once the report is released, the next steps will be to evaluate recommendations and move forward with initiatives that will improve services in St. Mary's.

The Project Team, made up of master students in various fields, interviewed Volunteer Fire Departments, performed data collection and research. Recommendations included improved communication and relations along with improving recruitment and retention of volunteer firefighters. The Final report including recommendations is available for viewing at the Municipal Office.
