### Housing NS – Landlord Rent Supplement Program

Nova Scotia landlords are invited to submit information for consideration under the Rent Supplement Program. Housing Nova Scotia is expanding this program by providing increased funding to provide affordable housing to families and individuals across the province.

The Rent Supplement Program provides safe, affordable rental accommodation for low-income families and individuals in the private rental market. Housing NS enters directly into an agreement with a property owner to subsidize a portion of the rent.

Landlords are encouraged to bring forward all types of rental opportunities. Those who present locations where the greatest need exists and offer the best value will be contacted first.

The type and number of units accepted is related directly to the local housing priority for subsidized units. All units will be inspected to ensure compliance for suitable maintenance, décor, services, amenities and management standards.

Good day Folks of St. Mary's, Another year is upon us and work is well under way at the St. Mary's River Association. My name is Scott Beaver and I am the President of the Association. As I did last summer, I'd like to give you a bit of an update as to what's on the go under our roof. Our West Branch Habitat Restoration Project is still going strong. This will be our 4<sup>th</sup> summer of river restoration and at the end of this summer we will have spent approximately a total of 900,000 dollars. This price tag gets you about 11 km of restored river. That seems like a lot of money and it is! But we believe that if our work contributes to more salmon in the St. Mary's River then it is worth it. You can view the restored areas taken from a drone at these youtube links:

We are happy to report that as a result of our restoration efforts, we are seeing increased signs of salmon in the restored locations. To assess this, we do redd counts before and after the restoration work. (Remember redds are the spots salmon make in the river beds for their eggs.) For us, the increased number of redds is very exciting and helps motivate us to continue with this project. The majority of funds raised for this project are coming from government and private grants. There are other initiatives we are investigating such as: lime dosing, culvert restoration and a more accurate method of counting salmon travelling the river. We are a volunteer organization with a hardworking, innovative group at the helm, so I'm optimistic we can accomplish at least one of these initiatives in the near future. Anyone interesting in volunteering, please contact us, we would love to have you. Our Annual General Meeting is held every year on the last Sunday of May. This year we had three guests: Darryl Murrant from Inland Fisheries, local boy Donnelly Archibald from St. FX and Charlie MacInnis of MacInnis Natural Resource Services. The Inland Fisheries team at the Fraser Mills Hatchery partnered with us on our Sea Trout Enhancement Project, details of which were presented at the AGM and will follow in a future newsletter. Donnelly has his doctorate in Geology and he talked about our local landforms and how they affect our river. Charlie is leading our West Branch Habitat Enhancement Project and talked about the work completed and the projected work for this summer. If you are interested in more information about topics like these you are very welcome to become a member of our association and attend our AGM every May. Besides our association's business, we like to have guest speakers and snacks for everyone and this all happens right in your back yard! Please come on in.

## **NS Health Authority**

It's a great time of the year to enjoy the outdoors, but we need to be aware and careful in areas where there may be blacklegged ticks. These ticks can carry the germ that causes a bacterial infection called Lyme disease. Follow these steps to help protect against ticks, especially in grassy, wooded areas;

Apply insect repellents containing DEET to exposed skin and clothes, Wear light colored long sleeved shirts and pants, closed shoes and tuck pant legs into socks, keep lawns mowed short, put playground equipment in sunny, dry places away from wooded areas, Perform daily tick checks.

If you find ticks, here's how to remove them safely; Carefully grasp the tick with tweezers as close to the skin as possible, gently pull the tick out straight, clean and disinfect the site, dispose of the tick in sealed plastic bag, do NOT burn, squeeze or coax a tick's mouthparts from your skin using other methods. ## **ACOA FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT FOR SHERBROOKE OPPORTUNITIES SOCIETY OR S.H.O.P.S. HELPS COMPLETE PROJECT**

Central Nova MP Sean Fraser was in Sherbrooke on Saturday, June 17<sup>th</sup> to make a funding announcement on behalf of the Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency or ACOA for the Sherbrooke Opportunities Society or S.H.O.P.S. for a total contribution of \$66,745. S.H.O.P.S. will match that contribution and the construction that is now taking place will complete the project. Memorial Place is the new wing attached to St. Mary's Education Centre and Academy that houses a room for Kids First and another that will provide a homebase/workshop for the developmentally challenged adults of the community and surrounding area. It will also serve as a memorial to past educators and veterans.

It's been a long road with delays that were out of our control, but we are so very excited for the future of S.H.O.P.S. and we now need the assistance of the community as a whole to see this unfold to its full potential. Plans are now underway to prepare and set programs in place so S.H.O.P.S. will be consulting with community members to ensure that Memorial Place provides the required needs for participants and area.
