If you disagree with the information on your assessment, contact PVSC to discuss your concerns before the final assessment notices are sent out. PVSC will be pleased to: review your property file, explain how the assessment was determined, explain eligibility requirements for the Capped Assessment Program, and answer your questions.

2017/18 Municipal Low Income Tax Exemption

The Municipality provides assistance to homeowners to help pay their residential property taxes. Qualified applicants will receive a \$110 credit which is applied directly to the tax account. Municipal Tax Sale

Waterline Replacement Project Update

The construction phase of the waterline replacement was awarded to CCT Consulting limited from Pictou County. The project got underway in mid-October and is scheduled to be completed by the end of February 2018. The new waterline will be installed and tested before switching the old system over, which is intended to minimize water supply interruptions for customers. Thank you for your patience during the construction period and change over to the new system.

2017 Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors

This program, through Service Nova Scotia, provides a 50% rebate of the actual Residential Municipal property taxes you paid, up to a maximum of \$800. Applications must be post marked by December 31st, 2017, program deadline. Applicants must receive or be eligible to receive the Guaranteed Income Supplements or the Allowance in January 2017 and have their 2016 Municipal Residential Property taxes paid in full. Applications are available at the Municipal Office.

Open Gym

Open Gym will be returning this fall to St. Mary's Education Centre and Academy. The program will take place each Tuesday evening from 6-7 p.m. **Our final day for Open Gym is November 21st.** If this program is successful, it will return in the New Year. All school aged children are invited to attend. Parents are encouraged to take part as well. Registration forms are necessary for all students. Students are not permitted in the school until the program begins.

St. Mary's 2026 – Strategic Plan Update

Background

St. Mary's 2026 is the Municipality of the District of St. Mary's Strategic Plan for the next 10 years. The plan was created through input from municipal council, municipal staff and members of the public. The plan is intended to guide the work of council and staff over the next 10 years in order to establish a collective vision, plan for the future and communicate priorities. The plan includes five strategic goals each of which are supported by several objectives and strategies.

Over the next five issues of the newsletter, we will provide a goal-by-goal update on the strategic plan.

Goal 1: To Increase Population of St. Mary's by 5% by 2021

Objective (a): support a sustainable and vibrant community

<p>Work towards achieving results in Shared Strategy</p>	<p>In October of 2017, St. Mary's Municipal Council officially endorsed the Shared Strategy for Recreation in Nova Scotia and the National Framework for Recreation in Canada. In addition, staff have completed the St. Mary's Active Living Strategy and an Active Living Coordinator has been hired (50% funded by the Province) to achieve results in identified areas of this plan. In the late summer, a public conversation was held by the municipality regarding Recplex programming for the upcoming 2017-18 season. The Trail Blazers youth outdoor education program was reinstated this fall, and has 15+ students taking part each week in Stonewall Park. Finally, the municipality is working towards creating more community champions to deliver programming in St. Mary's.</p>
<p>New and improved special events</p>	<p>The Municipality continues to support and participate in planning of special events in the community such as Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas and St. Mary's River Days. Currently, the Municipality is working on strengthening its own special events such as Canada Day Celebrations, Winter Fun Fest and creating volunteer celebrations.</p>
<p>Maintain and enhance municipal facilities</p>	<p>Staff continue to make progress on the Recplex Enhancement project that was made possible with a generous donation from the Roy Steed Trust. The Municipality's Active Transportation Committee is also making progress with improvements to Stonewall Park. A new trail head was created in the spring of 2017 and a signage strategy is currently being developed.</p>
<p>Create a youth retention strategy</p>	<p>As part of Municipal Awareness Week 2017, the Municipality will be working on creating a Youth Advisory Committee to council.</p>

Objective (b): Increase planning and economic development initiatives

<p>Update planning documents</p>	<p>The Municipality's Economic Development Officer is currently seeking funding to review and update the current Land Use Bylaw.</p>
<p>Collaborate with Regional Enterprise Network (REN)</p>	<p>The Municipality is working closely with the REN on regional population growth strategies. REN staff work out of the St. Mary's office twice a week.</p>
<p>Develop land use planning pilot project with province</p>	<p>The Municipality is currently seeking provincial funding and assistance with the Land Use Bylaw update. The intent is to identify areas of joint interest with the Province and to explore opportunities for development of provincial crown lands.</p>

Dear Friends of Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas,

November 24 to 26 and December 2 and 3, 2017 will mark the 22nd year of Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas, a time honoured, traditional, family friendly, community event.

Each year we continue to grow, with attendance in 2016 reaching well over 11,000, on opening night alone there were 7,500. It's wonderful for any event to experience such growth but the number of participants bring their own challenges. Predominantly, the safety of the community and visitors in attendance during the event. The scope of these challenges was discussed during a meeting held at the Municipal Office in the spring of 2017. In attendance were members from: The Old Fashioned Christmas Association; Sherbrooke Village staff; local RCMP; Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal and local municipal leaders. Legitimate safety concerns were raised and discussed at length. The group was informed during this time that blocking the main road would no longer be an option and no parade permit would be issued in future. A major concern was the amount of time Highway #7 (only access road to hospital & emergency vehicles) was closed to traffic. In the first 20 years of the event this road would be closed to traffic for approximately 20 to 40 minutes. Last year the procession took one hour and forty minutes. This also makes for a very long evening for small children as entertainment does not begin until most participants have arrived at the Performance Centre.

It was decided that the best option available was to relocate the Opening Night Tree Lighting and Candlelight Procession from its former location at Maple Manor on Main St. to within the Sherbrooke Village gates, therefore allowing continued travel on highway #7. This was not an easy decision. Beginning this year, the Sherbrooke Village Old Fashioned Christmas Tree will be located on the side lawn of St. James Presbyterian Church. The procession will begin there and continue down to the Performance Centre. The committee will be purchasing new lights for this tree. The tree located at Maple Manor will be intact and lit throughout the season for the community's enjoyment.

Committee members are proud to be able to continue to offer many free activities for families and children, including opening night entertainment by the Kidd Brothers, visit from Santa and fireworks; children's teas, petting zoo, crafts, sparkle tattoos, outdoor activities and candy making, despite rising costs. This year in addition we will be inviting children to visit "Whoville" and meet some of their favorite characters. We would like to thank everyone for their continued support and we look forward to seeing you this year!
