Undertake regular review of programs and services to ensure efficiency and identify areas for improvement	
Enhance community engagement and communication	Held public meetings, on-line surveys and open houses on economic / business development, budget information and recreational programming. The intent is to continue with community engagement activities and open communication on the municipal activities and to seek public participation in as many areas of municipal interest as possible.
Conduct comparative analysis of all Municipal programs and services	Conducted comparative analysis on solid waste collection and disposal to determine if contracting out is more cost effective than in-house operation. Analysis showed that contracting out is best approach to solid waste in Saint Mary's. Other comparative analysis will be undertaken in the future.
Request regular updates from major mandatory expenses; RCMP, SRSB, Department of transportation and Infrastructure Renewal, NS Housing Authority, Eastern Regional Library	An effort is made to have representatives from the various departments and agencies regularly attend Committee of the Whole (COTW) meeting to provide Council with updates on their activities and allow council to ask questions on the funding formulas and how the funding is expended. See COTW meeting minutes for more details.
Evaluate and improve municipal infrastructure	
Develop an asset management plan	Saint Mary's we will have a digital mapping of the new waterlines as a deliverable from the project. We will build on that base to add other infrastructure to the maps.
Develop a 10 year capital plan to be reviewed and updated annually	Developed a 10 year Capital Plan that is reviewed and updated each fiscal year during the budget process.
Actively seek funding opportunities	Successful in obtaining numerous grants such as 75% outside funding for waterline replacement, facilities grants for recreational programs and paving of Court Street. Will continue to seek funding opportunities to address additional work to improve the municipality.
Improve internal operational effectiveness	
Develop a succession plan	Planning started for a succession plan that identifies gaps and potential options for immediate interim measures as well as longer term solutions.
Provide training opportunities for staff and Council	Held a training & team building workshop this fall for staff and Council. Promoting training for Councillors through the UNSM, FCM, etc. Similarly, training for staff on specific areas of interest for the municipality.
Review and update policies and bylaws	A number of our policies and bylaws are dated and require updates to make them current and relevant. We are looking at establishing a priority list to determine the most immediate needs for updates.
Standardize reporting methods for outside Council committee appointments	A standard reporting template was developed and is in use for reports to Council.
Improve Occupational Health and Safety Practices	Working on a revamped JOHS manual and procedures as well as increased site inspections of municipal facilities.
To reduce the reliance on reserve funds	
Perform long range financial planning	Held preliminary discussions with Municipal Finance Corporation (MFC) regarding the use of the Debt Affordability Model for long term financial planning purposes. Will continue those discussions through budgeting process in coming months.
Identify opportunities for shared services	Working with the District of Guysborough to obtain Planning and Inspection services. We also work with a group of nine municipalities on a shared financial management system and continue to explore other services for consideration within that group.
