Trade Mission to China – November 7 – 14, 2018

Warden Michael Mosher and John Beaton, CEO from the Eastern Strait Regional Enterprise Network (ESREN) participated in a trade mission to China as part of a larger Canadian and Nova Scotian delegation of private sector and government officials. Ms. Grace Chum, President Atlantic New Technology Development Inc. with offices in Truro, NS as well as Toronto, Charlottetown and Shanghai organized the municipality's part in the mission, which included the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the municipality and Zhongshou Taiyang Health Enhancement & Technology Group. The Zhongshou Group is interested in expanding business development opportunities in Canada and the MOU is a commitment for the parties to continue exploring options within the District of St. Mary's. A starting point for the discussions relate to three specific potential projects for consideration: 1. Blood worm farm, 2. Medicinal plant cultivation/processing and 3. Chinese Medicine Health Enhancement Centre. Discussions with Ms. Chum began last June when she was introduced to the municipality by the ESREN. We will continue to promote other business opportunities as we proceed in discussions with Ms. Chum and representatives from the Zhongshou Group of companies.

Good day friends of the St Mary's. Scott Beaver here, President of the St. Mary's River Association. I want to talk to you today about something that is about to happen in our community that could impact all of us.

Atlantic Gold, an Australian Jr mining company, is proposing to operate a large gold mine at Cochrane Hill. This is of so much concern to us, that during the next few months the St. Mary's River Association will be making presentations to willing host community groups to help folks understand the risks associated with modern day gold mining. We would also like to open the doors at our Interpretive Center, just as you enter Sherbrooke, to anyone wishing to engage in a conversation about the gold mine. The first presentation at our IC building will be on Dec 5th at 7pm. Please come out, listen to our presentation and get informed especially if you're pro gold mine. We need to talk.....

I can tell you a few things in the meantime. Our organization's vision is the "Health for the River, Atlantic Salmon and our community." SMRA has taken a stance against this mine coming to our area. We did not come to this decision quickly I might add. Like most folks, at first glance we thought of our community's economy and what that may look like.

Once we did more research and details of the scope of the proposed project came to light, it was clear that we cannot let this mine come to our St. Mary's! It is simply too intrusive for the extremely short term gain a mine of this massive size would bring. This is why we have started a NOPE campaign (No Open Pit Excavation).

Historically and presently, the St. Mary's River was and is the centrepiece of our assets, our most enduring resource. Every community meeting I have attended regarding our Municipal 10 year strategic plan or with DEANS (Destination Eastern & Northumberland Shores) has focused on one main topic. The focus is quite frankly our rivers and promoting tourism to its fullest potential. This is the one thing that has kept small communities going and the one thing that will continue to keep our community going long after the mine is gone. It is, therefore, essential we protect our centrepiece with conviction.

I hope to see you around and don't hesitate to contact or ask me or our team anything at all. We are here for the St. Mary's River and our beautiful Community.
