## St. Mary's River Association 1.2 Million Dollar Federal Grant Update by Scott Beaver



Hello Folks! I hope summer 2019 is going well for you! As you might be aware, St. Mary's River Association has been granted 1.2 million dollars to continue our habit work and start a liming project. Federal Fisheries Minister, Johnathan Wilkinson and our MP Sean Fraser stopped by our Interpretive Center on May 8th to make the announcement.

In 2013 our organization released the *St Mary's River Atlantic Salmon Recovery Strategy*, and since the release of this report our organization has been busy implementing the recommendations. This recovery strategy identified key conservation measures that would be needed for the recovery of Atlantic salmon in our watershed. While some threats such as marine mortality may be beyond our control, our organization has been addressing four measures that will improve Atlantic salmon stocks in the St. Mary's River. The four items we chose to make our top priority are:

1. Habitat Restoration (if you build it, they will come - 1.2 million spent since 2014)
2. Stock Enhancement (Our Kelt and sea trout stocking program in partnership with DFO)
3. Removing barriers to fish passage, such as culverts
4. Improving water chemistry, in particular reversing the impacts of acid rain.

Since 2014 we are happy to say we have done work on three of these issues and now with our new funds we are capturing a piece of the fourth. We are starting our new 3 year project addressing the acidity of the West Branch St. Mary's River. Water Chemistry is a complex issue - water chemistry analysis on the West Branch tells us that the pH level is too low to support productive and healthy salmon populations. Our East, Main and North sections of the river are doing well with pH (acidity); the West branch has a different type of geology which is naturally more acidic, magnifying the effect of acid rain. Acidity is of concern to us because it can be detrimental to smolts with heavy metals in and around their gills. Keeping heavy metals out of the river and raising reducing acidity is our goal here.

Building on success of the Nova Scotia Salmon Association's acid rain mitigation project in Sheet Harbour, our organization has chosen to address acidity through the aerial application of powdered lime. Monitoring will be conducted throughout the restoration sites to determine the efficacy of these approaches as tools for the recovery of the Southern Uplands Atlantic salmon population. The techniques being used in this project have been developed in co-operation with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada and various non-government and academic partners as part of the West River Sheet Harbour Acid Rain Mitigation Project. This project has been very successful and the project team are seeing increased salmon returns each year!

2019 marks the first year of a three year study. SMRA has retained project management to complete base-line water chemistry analysis, develop a tree planting strategy, complete designated physical habitat restoration and install instruments needed to monitor temperature and acidity. In year 2 we will start liming selected sites, continue to monitor water chemistry, continue instream designated physical habitat restoration work, and plant trees. In year 3 we will complete water chemistry monitoring and determine the impact of liming on water quality; we will complete instream physical habitat restoration; and we will prepare the assessment report to document efficacy of aerial liming as a species recovery tool for the Southern Uplands Atlantic salmon population.

We have in the making a "first of its kind" project right here on the St. Mary's River! We are not only helping restore Atlantic Salmon to a population density that will allow us to open an angling season once again, but more importantly we are creating a model for other Atlantic Salmon bearing rivers to use all over! Now that's exciting and something our community should be very proud of.
