Property Rebates

Municipal Awareness Week

Municipal Awareness Week runs from Nov. 17th – Nov. 23rd.

This week promotes the importance of municipal government in people's daily lives, and encourages participation in Council meetings, public hearings and committees. It also celebrates the dedicated, wardens, councillors and staff who are essential to the effective governance and services of municipalities.

As a part of Municipal Awareness Week, St. Mary's will be hosting drop-in tours of our Water Treatment Facility. Join us on November 19th from 1:00-3:00 pm and from 6:00-8:00pm to see the journey our water takes before it makes it to the homes of our residents in Sherbrooke. Provincial Funding for Local Fire Departments

First-responder organizations in Guysborough County and across Nova Scotia will be able to purchase necessary safety equipment with a \$1.4 million investment from the province.

"First responders have an essential role in the safety of our communities, and we thank them for their dedication and commitment," said Premier Stephen McNeil in making the announcement Tuesday morning. "Many of these organizations are supported by volunteers, who put countless hours into training and responding to emergencies. This funding will help ensure they have the tools and equipment to keep them safe."

House League Hockey
