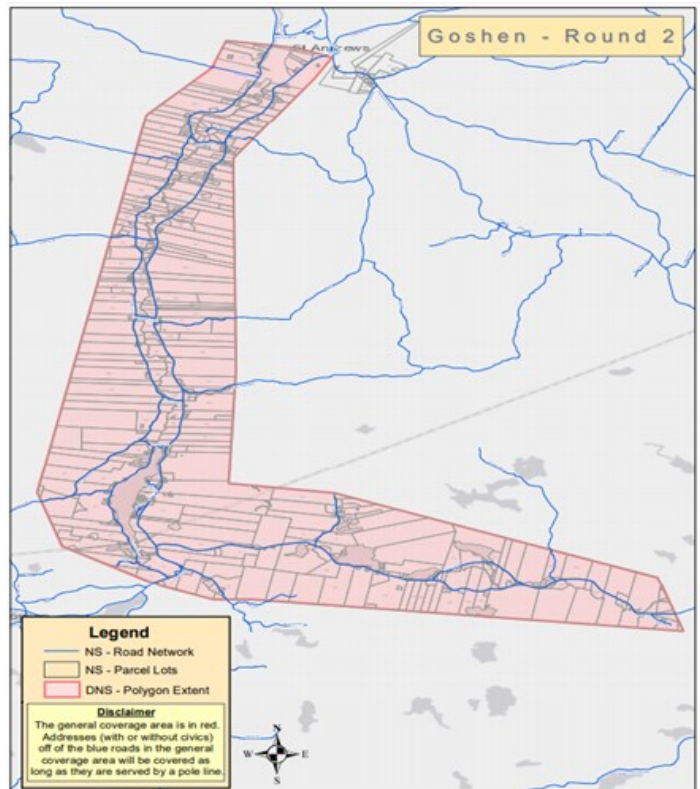
Develop NS Broadband Update

The Province is currently in the middle of the broadband project being implemented by "Develop NS". This project is aimed at delivering Internet to as close to 100% of Nova Scotians as possible. Since the first Internet for Nova Scotia Initiative projects were announced in February 2020, approximately 41,000 of a total of 87,200 homes and businesses already have the network in place to provide new or improved high-speed internet. Providers are working to connect the rest as quickly as possible.

The provider for most areas of St. Mary's Municipality will be Bell Aliant. These scope project areas have an anticipated completion date of December 2021- February 2022. The maps for Round 2 of the project have been developed and can be seen below.
