St. Mary's Truth and Reconciliation

The Municipality has set forth on a journey towards Truth and Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples of Canada. A Guiding Plan for Indigenous Education has been created for both council and staff to use as a guide in their efforts to educate themselves around our shared history with Indigenous Peoples as well as issues facing the Indigenous Community. A Public version of this document will be made available for any community members. Municipal Council has also developed a land acknowledgement that is said before all meetings of council and printed at the top of all meeting agendas. The Municipality is currently working on developing partnerships within the Indigenous Community to help design, create and install a commemorative piece for children of Residential Schools, including both the ones who made it home and those that did not. Municipal Council is officially recognizing September 30th as National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. Municipal Facilities will be closed on this day. The Municipality has resources available for members of the public to take or borrow that will help in individual Truth and Reconciliation education and efforts. Reporting to the Superintendent of Public Works, the Facilities Operator/Grounds Maintenance will ensure/perform; in conjunction with public works staff, the overall duties required in the operations of Municipal facilities. Municipal facilities include but are not limited to; Municipal Transfer Station, Sewer Treatment Plant, Water Treatment Plant and the St. Mary's Recplex. Other general and grounds maintenance throughout Municipal properties will be a part of daily routine.

Education and Qualifications:

- Candidates must have a minimum of grade 12 education. Trade certificates in plumbing, electrical, water/wastewater, refrigeration, or mechanics considered an asset. Other combinations of education and experience may be considered.
- Applicants must be mechanically inclined and be able to problem solve and work independently.

Federal Government Extends Business Support Measures Through the Pandemic

To support Canadians and Canadian businesses through the pandemic, the federal government introduced a comprehensive set of support measures, including the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy, Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy and Lockdown Support. These programs have supported millions of workers and continue to adapt as the pandemic evolves. The Government of Canada is extending these measures until October 23, 2021, and increasing the wage and rent subsidy rates between August 29 and September 25, 2021. The government is also proposing technical changes and clarifications to increase flexibility and certainty for organizations using these programs and the Canada Recovery Hiring Program introduced in Budget 2021. Federal Tourism Relief Fund

The Tourism Relief Fund supports tourism businesses and organizations to adapt their operations to meet public health requirements while investing in products and services to facilitate their future growth. With a budget of \$500 million over two years (ending March 31, 2023) this fund will position Canada to be a destination of choice when domestic and international travel is once again safe. ACOA is administering the fund in our region with a budget of \$48.5 million, 10% of which will be allocated specifically for Indigenous tourism. Contributions to businesses will be either a non-repayable contribution up to \$100,000 for up to 50 percent of eligible costs; or fully repayable contributions up to \$500,000 for up to 75 percent of eligible costs. 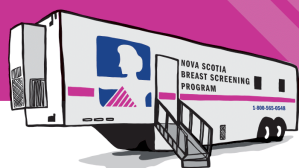
