Municipal Boundary Review NSUARB Hearing

On April 25th the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSUARB) hosted a Public Hearing for the Municipality's submission to confirm the number of councillors to be elected and to alter the boundaries of the polling districts. At the hearing, Jennifer Nicholson a member of the NSUARB heard a presentation from Ian Watson, Senior Planner of Upland Planning and Design Studio on the Municipality's submission. Ms. Nicholson also asked many questions which were responded to by Warden Wier, Mr. Watson & the Director of Finance. The Municipality should receive the decision of the NSUARB within 60 days.

Executive Recruitment Services for the CAO Position

Current CAO, Marissa Jordan, has given her resignation as she will be relocating to PEI in the coming months. Council has posted the employment opportunity for the Chief Administrative Officer and has recently hired an Executive Recruitment firm to assist in the recruitment of the new Chief Administration Officer. 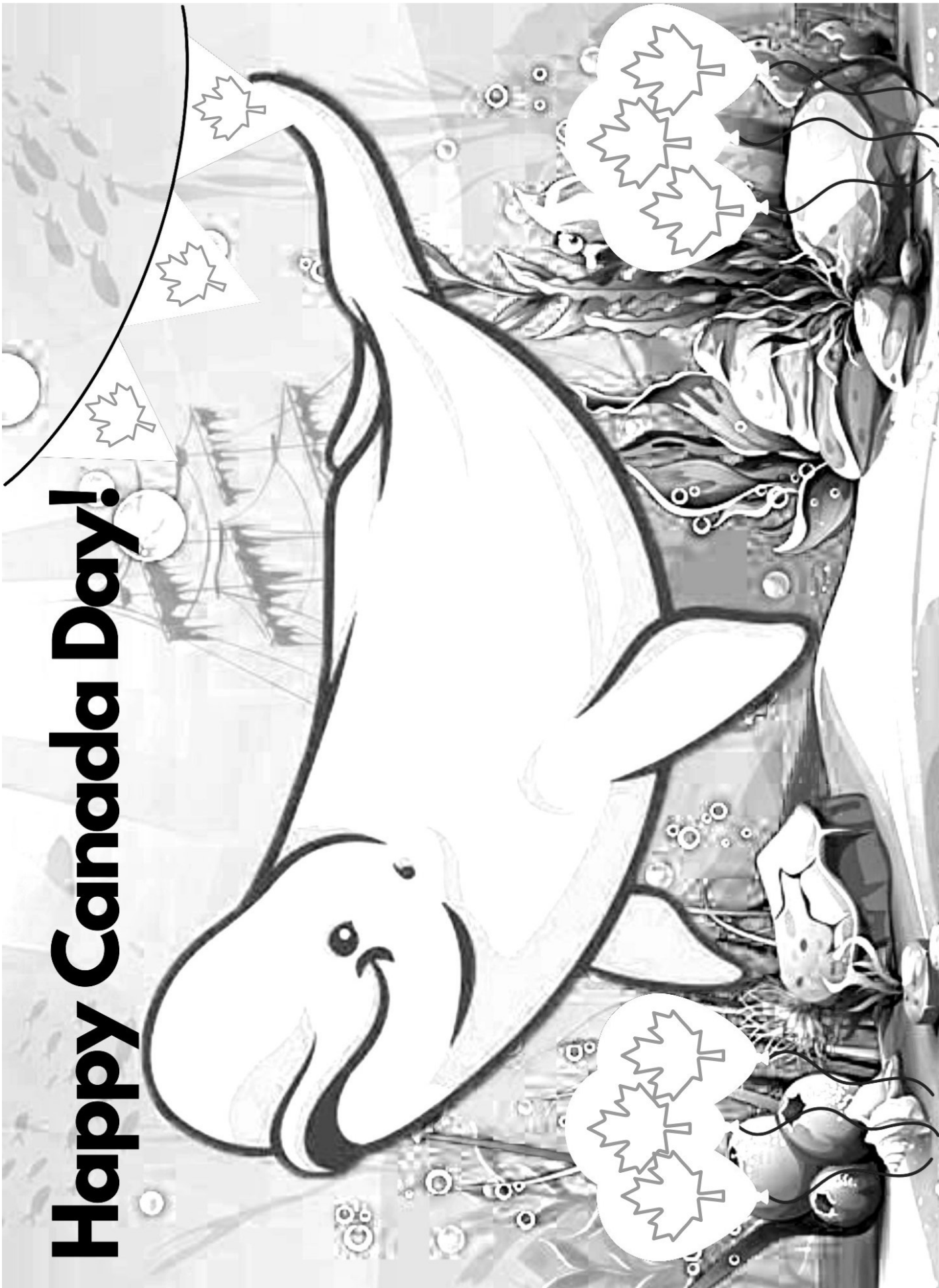
