**National Truth and Reconciliation Day** 

National Truth and Reconciliation Day takes place on September 30th, 2023. The day honours the children who never returned home and survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. National Orange Shirt Day is also on September 30th. Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Canadians are encouraged to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools. Keep an eye out for ways in which the Municipality will be honouring National Truth and Reconciliation Day and National Orange Shirt Day this year.

**No Parking on Main Street** 

The Municipality is requesting individuals not to park on the sides of the road next to sidewalks on Main Street. Please use the designated parking areas. Please note that it is against section 143(1)I of the Motor Vehicle Act to park a vehicle while either attended or unattended on a sidewalk.

**Land Development Committee Update** 

The 2022-2023 Land Development Committee's (LDC) purpose was to provide recommendations to Council regarding strategic planning and development for municipal owned land; to provide recommendations or best practices to achieve the desired priorities with consideration of valued perspectives. The Stakeholder feedback was requested based on the Land Development Committee Policy, Section 5.2 Perspectives for Consideration, and heard in person, virtual and online forms. After feedback consideration, the four priorities were identified as Housing, Childcare, Skilled Labour and Greenhouse Gas Reduction. The LDC tested the priorities against the purpose of the committee to create 14 Recommended Actions and where the priority fell outside the purpose of the Committee, the 10 Pathways to Action were created and shared with Council to inform their future work. Council approved and adopted the report in its entirety on July 10th, 2023. The What We Heard and Final Recommendations Report is available to view online at saint-marys.ca/municipaldocuments.

**Streetscapes Funding Announcement** 

On August 18, 2023, the Honourable Sean Fraser, Minister of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities, and Member of Parliament for Central Nova announced an additional investment of \$40,000 to the Municipality of the District of St. Mary's for enhancements in the Sherbrooke Streetscape Project which included, sidewalks and curbing for accessible and safer pathways to Main Street amenities.

**Accessibility Funding** 

The Municipality is pleased to announce that it has secured \$115,347 in funding to complete the Municipal Facility Access Project. This project will allow the Municipality to install accessible doors throughout the Recplex and Sherbrooke Public Library. This work is to be completed in the 2024-25 fiscal year. This project is funded in part by the Government of Canada's Enabling Accessibility Fund.

**Business ACCESS-Ability Program** 

The Province is accepting applications for the Business ACCESS-Ability program. Businesses can apply for a cost -shared grant to make accessibility-related improvements. Improvements can be for clients and customers, for employees, or both. The five categories for funding include: the Built Environment, Accessible Communications Services, Assistive Devices, Universal Design Capacity Building and Accessible Transportation. **Provincial Senior Property Tax Rebate** 

The Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors helps low -income seniors with the cost of municipal residential property taxes. Rebates are 50% of what you paid on last year's property taxes, up to a maximum of \$800. You can apply until December 31st, 2023. Residential Low Income Property Tax Exemption

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's provides assistance to homeowners to help pay their residential property taxes. Qualified applicants will receive a credit which is applied directly to the tax account. #### Sherbrooke's Source Water: Did You Know?

Wetlands are one of the most biodiverse habitats and support a wide range of human activities such as fishing, recreation and education. They also have important functions for both humans and wildlife such as: providing flood protection by absorbing sudden heavy precipitation or snowmelt and naturally improving water quality by acting like a sink, that traps carbon and other chemicals. The destruction of wetlands can cause flood and drought damage, increase the cost of water treatment, and cause a decline in wildlife populations.

#### **Commercial Welk Fishery in Eastern Nova Scotia**

The Government of Canada is committed to increasing opportunity in the fishing and fish processing sectors to drive economic development without compromising conservation. Fisheries and Oceans Canada has determined a commercial whelk fishery in Northwest Atlantic Fisheries Organization Area 4Vs would be both economically and biologically sustainable. This exploratory whelk fishery will support roughly 55 jobs in Eastern Nova Scotia. Once the new, commercial whelk fishery is underway in Spring 2024, it will generate even more economic opportunities and benefits for Nova Scotians.

#### Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership
