## **Heat Pump Assistance Available to Eligible Applicants**

Need assistance with heating your home?

There are grants available through Efficiency Nova Scotia and the Heat Fund to help assist in getting heat pumps or heating assistance in place to help heat your home next year. Find out if you are eligible by accessing their website: [www.energycns.ca](http://www.energycns.ca)

Efficiency Nova Scotia has a few different applications you can fill out to assist in Heat pumps, better insulation, draft proofing, windows, doors, and other upgrades, to check eligibility visit the URL above. You have to own a single-unit home located in Nova Scotia and can provide proof of ownership, live in your home year-round, primary residence, the home is at least 6 months old, and no major renovations have been started.

## **New Long-Term Care Rooms for Sherbrooke**

Seniors in the Sherbrooke area who need long-term care will have access to modern spaces with the replacement of the local nursing home. The new 48-room High-Crest Sherbrooke nursing home, scheduled to open in 2029, will provide care to an additional nine seniors. Each resident will have their own room and private washroom. ## **Grants to Organizations**

2024-2025 General Government Grants  
The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's provides grants to organizations annually through an application process to Council with a focus on capital projects. Organizations must be active with the Registry of Joint Stocks, and must be located within the Municipality or serve/benefit residents within the Municipality. Deadline to submit an application is February 15, 2024. If an organization receives \$1,000 or greater they must complete a grants to organizations evaluation form (found on the municipal website) on how the money was spent by February 15th of the current year. If the form is not completed the organization/group will not be eligible for a grant in the following fiscal year.

## **Secondary or Backyard Suites**

Did you know that secondary or backyard suites are permitted in St. Mary's anywhere a single detached dwelling permitted? Funding is available from the province for up to 50% of eligible project costs, to a maximum of \$25,000. The applicant needs to fund the remaining balance of the project. The funding provides a forgivable loan. Terms of up to 5 years are available. Funding for more than 1 secondary or backyard suite may be available. Eligible projects need to provide secondary or backyard suites that: (1) meet all municipal requirements (2) are on the property of the homeowner's primary residence. A primary residence must be a single-family home that meets health and safety standards. It also needs to have enough space to accommodate a secondary or backyard suite.
