Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors

This program, administered by Service Nova Scotia on behalf of the Department of Community Services, is designed to help eligible seniors remain in their homes by providing an annual rebate on their municipal property taxes. Provincial Property Tax Rebate forms are available at the Municipal Office after July 1st, 2024. The deadline to apply is December 31st, 2024. Call 902-522-2049 for more information.

Municipal Low Income Property Tax Exemption

The Municipality provides a property tax exemption to assist low-income homeowners to pay their residential property taxes. Approved property owners will receive a credit of \$180 on their tax account. The total annual household income for the 2024/2025 year is \$25,280. By preventing pollutants from entering source waters, we reduce the need for extensive treatment processes, thus ensuring cleaner and safer water for communities. Protecting source water helps maintain biodiversity, supports recreational activities, and enhances the resilience of water supplies against climate change impacts. Collaborative efforts among government agencies, local communities, and stakeholders are essential to implement comprehensive source water protection plans that secure a healthy and sustainable water future.

Provincial Fire Restrictions

Open fires (like campfires) are not allowed from 8am to 2pm. Check the Fire Restriction Map daily after 2pm at <https://novascotia.ca/burnsafe/> or call

to see restrictions for the day. People can also call 1-855-564- 2876 (BURN) for this information. Devices like gas stoves and charcoal briquette barbeques can be used anytime, following manufacturer's instructions.

The Province has just announced that the fine for violating the daily burn restrictions has been increased to \$25,000 for this wildfire season. The fine amounts are set in the Summary Offence Ticket Regulations. The \$25,000 fine also includes HST and a victim surcharge, bringing the total to \$28,872.50. Conservation officers, police and other law enforcement officers can issue the fine on the spot in the form of a summary offence ticket. Visit novascotia.ca/BurnSafe.
