The Municipality uses Voyent Alert to share water utility notices, important updates and daily notices. Alerts can be sent to your phone, landline, or email. Battery Disposal

The Municipal Office is a free battery drop-off location for residents! Properly storing and disposing of batteries helps prevent explosions, leaks, and environmental damage. Please do not place batteries in your regular garbage or recycling. Be sure to check your devices—such as laptops, cellphones, and power tools—for swollen or damaged batteries and bring them in for safe disposal. Batteries are considered Household Hazardous Waste. You can drop them off for free at the Municipal Office.

Civic Sign Etiquette

This is your reminder to check your sign today! A visible civic sign helps emergency services, first responders, EHS, RCMP, delivery drivers, and visitors find your location quickly when it matters most. Ensure your sign is visible from the road. Volunteer of the Year

The Municipality of the District of St. Mary's is proud to recognize Bruce Sinclair as this year's Municipal Volunteer of the Year. Bruce is a sixth-generation dairy and sheep farmer residing in Goshen, currently milking cows and raising breeding stock sheep on his 200-year-old family farm. Bruce is the current Chair of the Eastern Nova Scotia Exhibition in Antigonish, showcasing agriculture to the public. He has been a 4-H leader for 35 years and continues to work and mentor youth with livestock projects. For many years he has served on various local, provincial and national agriculture boards promoting sheep and dairy. Bruce has been a volunteer with the Goshen Fire Department for 33 years and Chief for the past 10 years. Besides the normal duties of Chief, he also procures grants and funding, ensures vehicles and equipment are maintained and that ongoing training and education continue for the department members. Because of his leadership, the department continues to serve our community. Thank you Bruce!

Municipal Recycling Program

Starting December 1st, St. Mary's recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a national not-for-profit organization that is committed to building an efficient and effective recycling system in Nova Scotia. Curbside collection will continue and will now include more items, see the list on page 4. As part of the new program, flexible plastics, aerosol containers and foam packaging will now be returned to MacMillan's Recycling Depot. Municipal Drought Response

The Water Distribution Program will conclude once the remaining stock has been distributed. Recent rainfall and reduced participation have decreased the need for continued distribution. The public will be notified when all remaining stock has been distributed.

Residents are reminded that well water testing is especially important at this time and should be done annually. Testing kits are available at the Municipal Office. EV Chargers at the Municipal Office

The Municipality partnered with Nova Scotia Power to install two fast-charging electric vehicle (EV) chargers at the Municipal Office. This initiative supports expanded access to clean transportation options across the Province, helps encourage the use of electric vehicles in our region, and provides a convenient charging location for both residents and visitors.

Winter Preparedness

The Municipality encourages all residents to take a few simple steps to stay safe and prepared during the colder months. Now is a great time to check your emergency supplies, including flashlights, batteries, blankets, medications, and enough food and water to last at least 72 hours. Preparing your home is equally important—ensure walkways are clear, heating systems are working properly, and smoke and carbon monoxide detectors have fresh batteries. Residents are also reminded to drive with caution during winter weather. Keep your vehicle stocked with an emergency kit, winter tires, and a full tank of gas whenever possible. Staying informed is key—monitor local weather alerts and updates to know what conditions to expect. Taking a few proactive steps now can help keep you and your family safe all season long.

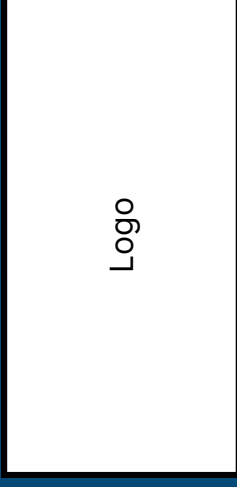

Paper Based Products Bag

Cardboard Boxes: Pizza boxes, direct mailboxes, moving boxes, shoe boxes. *Empty & place flattened and bundled cardboard 60 x 60 cm next to blue bags at the curb.*

Boxboard: Cereal boxes, tissue boxes, egg cartons, rolls from toilet paper and paper towel. *Empty & Flatten*

Paper: Any colour, including flour bags, prescription bags, paper produce bags. Notepads, white or coloured loose paper, file folders, other printed materials. Community newspapers, flyers, brochures and magazines. Greeting cards and envelopes, gift boxes. *Place paper in a tied clear plastic bag. Separate from plastic bags used to cover items, remove elastic bands and rope handles. Do not include soft or hard covered books/novels.*

Paper Laminate Packaging: Plates, flour bags, paper and gift bags, muffin or sandwich bags. *Empty.*

Containers Bag

Plastic Containers: Laundry detergent and household cleaner jugs, shampoo, body wash, salad dressing, condiment, dish soap, mouth wash bottles. Food trays, salad, yogurt, peanut butter, bakery and egg containers, plastic cups, plastic tubs and lids. Toothpaste tubes, deodorant, hand cream tubes. Small item packaging, hand sanitizer bottles, plant pots. *Empty with lids and caps on.*

Plastic Film: Plastic that can be stretched. Bags used for dry cleaning, bread, newspapers and flyers. Sandwich bags, freezer bags, shrink wrap. *Empty.*

Paper Laminate Packaging: Spiral cans, cookie dough package, ice cream containers, and hot and cold beverage cups. *Rinse and dry and remove lids.*

Cartons: Dairy and dairy substitute cartons, molasses and sugar cartons, laundry and cleaning cartons, soup and sauce cartons, coffee cartons. *Rinse and dry with lids and caps on.*

Metal: Food cans, metal lids, candle, cookie, coffee and tea tins. *Rinse and dry.*

Aluminum: Aluminum foil, pie plates, frozen food trays. *Empty. Ball up aluminum foil.*

Glass Containers: Clear and coloured glass. Food containers, jars and bottles. Cosmetic containers, spice bottles, oil and vinegar bottles. *Empty and lids and caps off.*

Recycling Depot

These items will now be collected by MacMillan's Recycling Depot:

Aerosol Containers: Food spray, hairspray, air fresheners, shaving cream, deodorant. *Empty with lids and caps on.*

Flexible Plastics: Coffee or deli pouches, chip bags, bubble wrap, vacuum packaging, candy and snack wrappers, cereal liner bags, gift bags. *Empty.*

Foam Packaging: Meat trays, takeout containers, cups, plates, bowls, foam packaging.

Empty and remove film wrap and absorbent pads from meat trays.
