The service starts on June 25th. To request delivery, please call 902-863-4046. Prescriptions should be requested by Tuesday afternoon to ensure Thursday delivery.

Payment can currently be made by pre-authorized credit card. They are hoping to offer debit payment options in the future. Patients must present photo ID when picking up prescriptions. If someone else will be picking up the prescription, please call the pharmacy at 902-863-4046 to authorize that individual. Prescriptions cannot be left at the library. If unable to pick up medications during the designated time, they will be returned to Antigonish and will be available for pickup at the pharmacy the following day.
