• 1/3 Councillor Tax Exception

- Approximately ten of the fifty Nova Scotia municipalities have made a decision regarding the upcoming 1/3 tax exception changes. All ten have decided to increase their councillor's salaries to compensate for the change.
- o Marian presented various income examples of the 1/3 tax exception impact.
- Council requested that Marian provide an example of the impact based on the average
 St. Mary's income plus Council income.
- Of the rural Nova Scotia municipalities, St. Mary's council members have the lowest salaries per year.
- o Of the rural Nova Scotia municipalities, St. Mary's council members are the highest paid per constituent.
- Council decided to wait until April 1st, 2019 before implementing any possible salary changes.
- The decisions on council salaries will be addressed during the 2019/20 budget discussions.

• Eastside Water

- o Council was presented with water rate increase scenarios should the water project deficit be paid for through the Sherbrooke Water Utility.
- O Discussions surrounding how the deficit should be paid, Sherbrooke Water Utility versus the Municipality as a whole.
- O Questions included: Will increasing water rates be too much of a burden on low income households? Would rate increases deter future business ventures? Should residents outside of Sherbrooke pay towards the deficit when they pay for their water usage in other ways (wells, laundromats, etc.)?
- o To increase water rates an application to the Utility and Review Board (UARB) would need to be submitted very soon to start the process.

On recommendation of Councillor Findlay and seconded by Councillor Smith that the \$202,100 Eastside Water Project deficit be paid for with municipal reserve funds. The decision on which reserve fund to be made by March 31, 2019.

Recommendation adopted. (2 Nay - Deputy Warden Dort & Councillor Kaiser-Kirk)

Atlantic Gold

- The Atlantic Gold Community Liaison Committee met this week.
- Atlantic Gold has submitted the project description to the Federal Government for their consideration under the Environment Assessment Act.
- The project description will be made public after 10 days on the CEAA website.
- Construction on the Cochrane Hill site is slated to start in 2021 with the mine coming online in 2022.


Councillor Kaiser-Kirk left 2:16pm

- Council would like to meet with Atlantic Gold after we receive an application to amend the planning documents.
- Submission of Expense Reports

 - Some members of Council have been late submitting their claims which delays processing and posting to the website.
- Engage St. Mary's Feedback
 - Mike and Marvin will be speaking with Michael Flood later today.

 - There was a good turnout of local residents but some would like to see the business community better represented.
 - o Participants would like to know what will come as a result of the session.







HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS






MATCH


The Connectees will be matched based on industry experience, professional backgrounds, or the Connectee's interest in a specific industry.

Once the connection has been made, an introduction email is sent to the Connector and Connectee to setup a meeting.



CONNECT

to discuss things like: industry backgrounds, skills and areas of expertise, industry related Once the match has been made, the connector and the Connectee will meet face-to-face news, current market demands, and hidden job opportunities in the community



REFER

network, and then each of these people are asked to refer the Connectee to three more. These referrals may be potential employers, influential leaders within their industry or Connectors are asked to refer the Connectee to a minimum of three people in their other people who will benefit from meeting with a skilled professional.

REFERRED PEOPLE ARE NOT ALWAYS A FIT


Referrals are not guaranteed participation in the program. However, most referrals are a good fit. It is the coordinator's role to determine eligibility and it is normal that some referrals are not ready for participation.

AS ALWAYS, PROFESSIONALISM COUNTS

Program participants are matched with industry leaders to begin building their network. This is not a job interview, but participants do well to treat all steps of this program professionally.


