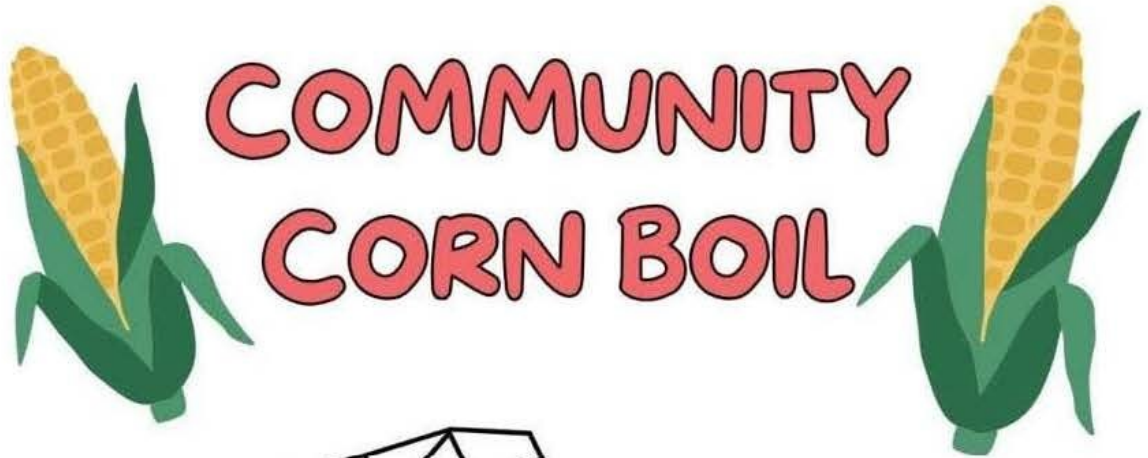
We look forward to bringing these groups together for a special evening of appreciation and celebration— to say thank you to some of the many people who make St. Mary's such a special place to call home.

The goal of this two-year program is to improve the quality, safety, and efficiency of care GCHSA provides. During the two years preparing for the August 19-21/26 on-site survey with Accreditation Canada, GCHSA did a comprehensive self-assessment and developed a quality improvement action plan (QIAP). The QIAP helped the Agency focus on processes and policies for service delivery, safety practices for both clients and employees, governance, leadership (management and staff), and people-centred care. This two-year program was step one of GCHSA working toward achieving continuous improvement in the delivery of quality care. GCHSA will now embark on the next step of its quality improvement journey - Qmentum Global, a three year program that focuses on community standards for home care.
